
Summer is about over and what a busy one we've had. The number of animals coming into the shelter has not slowed down by any means. Especially cats and kittens. We

With the number of cats and kittens we're receiving, we have discovered, even more than before, that our current cat quarantine is not adequate! The room can only hold 20-25 cats comfortably. We have to find additional space for 25-30 cats. We need a new cat quarantine space. Desperately. We have received quotes to build an addition onto the back of the building. We are working to secure grants for the bulk of this project. With a new cat quarantine space, we will be able to comfortably house the cats and kittens and help even more cats and kittens waiting to be surrendered.

The new cat quarantine space will

too late. We received a call that a mother cat was killed in the road. A lone kitten survivor was rushed to MHS. When the kitten was pulled out of the box we knew the chances were slim, but we don't give up easily. It happened to arrive when our







volunteer veterinary technician, now MHS employee, Melodie was here. She worked on him and cleaned him. We fed him and thought he was going to pull through. Unfortunately, he died several days later in a foster home. We try.

Out with the trash. Oh no!

We received a frantic call in August about a kitten in a dumpster. We are not entirely sure if she was thrown in there or managed to fall in. Regardless, she was rescued and is safe at the shelter. She is blossoming into a sweet kitty. She will be soon be up for adoption!

A box full of puppies

A mother dog and 10 beautiful puppies were surrendered to MHS in July. The mother, who is a sweetheart, is still available for adoption. Inside the box were 10 beautiful puppies! 5 males. 5 females. As you can imagine, they were adopted very quickly and all have found wonderful new homes!

MHS In The Field

We are currently working on a case involving 75+ cats and kittens. All the cats are feral and we will be working with the land owner on spaying or neutering. Stay tuned for December 2016 for an update.


